Our efforts continue to have a positive impact in the community. We have helped 125 families with much needed improvements to make the homes safe and secure and it is always gratifying to be a part of an organization that can make these repairs in short time. Contractors, carpenters, electricians, plumbers, and many unskilled volunteers join forces to replace roofs, build access ramps, install new windows and doors, along with many other home repairs in one day for the elderly, disabled and low-income families.

During "Rebuilding Day 2006", we helped 10 families by replacing five roofs, installed 15 new windows and four new doors, provided electrical and heating repairs to three homes, and fixed numerous safety hazards for five of the houses. These efforts are possible by combining the support from 100 volunteers and the much needed financial support from our sponsors.

We are part of a national organization that produces amazing results from 250 affiliates of Rebuilding Together. Each affiliate is successful by the vision, planning, and dedication from many volunteers throughout the year and the commitment from the board of directors.
