During "Rebuilding Day 2008," we helped 9 families by replacing entry steps, installing windows and doors, making electrical and heating repairs, and fixing numerous safety hazards for five of the houses. These efforts are possible by combining the support from over 85 volunteers and the much needed financial support from our sponsors.
